**Keynote Address by Prof. L. C. Mallaiah, Dept. of Economics, B.B. Ambedhkar
Central University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh:**

Under the theme “AN IMPACT OF DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAMMES FOR SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES” this ICSSR-IMPRESS Sponsored Two-Day National Seminar can concentrate on the computation and under the Impact of Tribal & Scheduled Castes Groups that is one in all the new major tools for developmental programmes for social transformation of SC’s & ST’s. In support of the topic, I will be able to discuss the main transformation of a gift to the society and its potential.

I am very happy that such a good number of participants have joined the KBN family, from different parts of Indian and across the globe. I feel this massive group action, calls increasing awareness of the urgency and importance of the Theme of this ICSSR (IMPRESS) Sponsored Two – Day National Seminar.

It is a time that the thought of recent strategies and transformation of SC’s & ST’s development was initiated in the country. However majority of SC’s & ST’s could not upgrade themselves with recent developments and therefore failed in terms of effective implementation of policies. No doubt, these groups are still in emerging stage. At this point, in such case identity, we want to concentrate on the vital functions of SC’s & ST’s. The SC’s & ST’s group development we should always integrate it into process and help in the preservations of SC’s & ST’s groups.

I contemplate that assertions are created repeatedly on several occasions. When compared to the recent development of the Dalit groups in the third world country’s, India

found to be very slow in terms of the SC's & ST's group activities either in terms of scaling the fair price for the SC's & ST's products or expanding opportunities of the tribal groups for fullest participation in the democratic process.

The SC's & ST's group economy can't be integrated in essence, while not establishing the tools for integration in corporations that play a central half within the development of the present tribal group economic activities. In this sense, SC's & ST's group development is one in all the tools that integrate trendy strategies, and it is applied to corporations, native governments and different organizations. The function of social group development is roughly divided into 2 categories: external SC's & ST's development, that is meant to disclose data, and internal social group development, that is managed at frequent intervals programmes.

However in India, several initiatives for SC's & ST's group's development have been initiated by the government agencies. The Ministry of Tribal Affairs issued guidelines for SC's & ST's Development. The overall, government initiatives support the SC's & ST's development.

Although several organisation and stakeholders filed PILs in the interest of the SC's & ST's groups development & protection, so far no clear cut policies are framed and developed at the National & State level, for guaranteeing the amount of compliance to the SC's & ST's group's development policies & norms.

I hope we are going to discuss as many challenges as possible to contribute to the long run growth of SC's & ST's group's development. Before I conclude I appreciate all the participants for your enthusiasm in this pursuit.

Dr. K.Madhu Babu, Head & Dept of Economics, Acharya Nagarjuna University, Guntur, Guest of Honour. The Chief Guest Addressed the participants on various suitations being faced by the Tribals development programmes. Especially, pertaining to the Tribal Development. According to him government of Andhra Pradesh is giving the highest priority in developmental issues. He lauded the efforts of the college for conducting a National Seminar on the topic of great contemporary relevance.
